### *A Message from Mother Gerry*

I got up early one morning, still in my pajamas, and ran out quickly to get the paper. It was still dark. If it had been light, I would have put on some proper clothes first. The light would have revealed my true condition – not dressed for the neighbors to see.

So it goes for all of us when it comes to sin. We don't want anyone to know what our sin looks like – what we have done, or what we would like to do, or what we are thinking about doing. We want to show our good side to the world. But, John writes in his gospel that the Light has come into the world to reveal all those things we do in darkness, all those things we long to hide from



everyone, even ourselves.

God in his infinite love and grace sent His Son, Jesus Christ, the Light of the world. And Jesus will not leave us in our sinful condition. He will bring his light into the darkest corners of our heart to expose what is there so we can confess it and receive forgiveness and have life.

The Light has come to rescue us. Of course, there is a choice – come to the Light or remain in darkness. But, we remain lovers of the darkness at our own peril. During the next two weeks of Advent, we have the opportunity to think about

our sinfulness and to repent and start afresh. Advent is a time of active waiting. We are meant to use this time to prepare ourselves for Christmas Day when we celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior, and to prepare for his return. He has promised that he will return and at that time he will make our way straight and put all things right – no more sin, or sickness, or sorrow. No more death.

During the next few days, I encourage you to wisely open your heart and let the Light come in. Warning: expect changes to be made. Jesus will not sit quietly in the parlor. He will rearrange the furniture; throw out what is broken and tattered, and clean up those dark corners. He will rummage through your hidden stuff, sorting it out. When the Light comes, changes follow. And this is good. It is just what we need to prepare for that final visit when he will return and take us to his Kingdom. Come, Lord Jesus!
